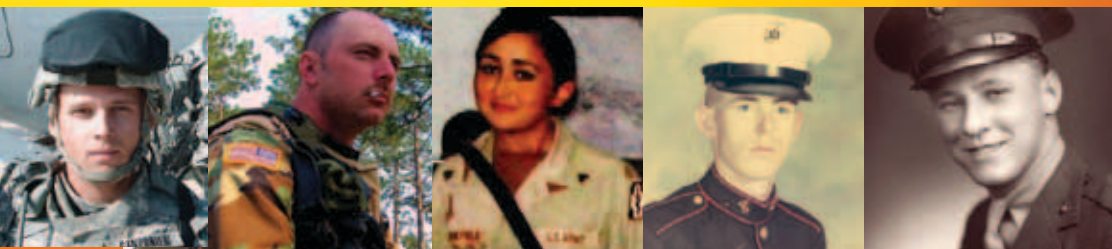

On April 2, 1936, the 22-year-old son of a sharecropper entered the Olympic Stadium in Berlin. The young athlete would channel his raw emotions into some of the most remarkable achievements in the history of athletics, winning four gold medals. To tell the story of Owens' remarkable victories in the face of Nazi racism, this film begins in the poor Cleveland neighborhood where the young athlete grew up details his early career; describes Adolf Hitler's outsized ambitions for the 1936 Olympics; explores the movement in Western democracies to boycott the event; and explains the pressures on Owens to attend.

*Johnny Carson: American Masters*



Johnny Carson (10/23/1925 – 1/23/2005) was seen by more people on more occasions than anyone else in American history. In a 2007 TV Land/Entertainment Weekly poll, Americans voted Carson the greatest icon in the history of television. 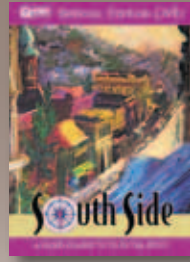

# Changing Lives Together

## WQED: The Create Channel Offers All the Comforts of Home

May is National Mental Health Awareness Month, and WQED has scheduled some very compelling programming, both locally and nationally produced, to shed light on the issue.

As you know, WQED has a history of producing and airing programming like this to shine a light on issues with follow-up discussion through community panel discussions in our studio that are often broadcast. We consider it a hallmark of our mission in keeping the community informed and providing resources for people to access.

Three locally-produced programs merit attention this month.

A compelling documentary that we produced last year that will air during Mental Health Awareness Month is *Long Road Home* on May 24 at 8 pm. Exploring the impact of wartime Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), *Long Road Home* offers stories of Pittsburgh-area military veterans of Vietnam, Korea, World War II and recent wars still coming to terms with the emotional wounds of war. The film explores successful therapies and documents the promising research underway at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center and concludes on a hopeful note, with a visit to a weekend retreat for veterans dealing with PTSD and combat stress.

*Losing Lambert: A Journey Through Survival & Hope* airs on May 24 at 10:30 pm and deals with teen suicide and its effects on the family left behind. Kathy O'Hern Fowler, who lost her 16-year-old son to suicide in 1995, spent years struggling with the loss and grief. The life-altering experience led her to advocate for other parents who tragically find themselves in the same position. This touching and insightful documentary explores the heart-rending questions left in the wake of suicide, interviews parents struggling to cope with the pain and stigma, and offers hope for the future of suicide prevention.



Tony Canzonieri of Charleroi talks openly about his struggle with prescription drugs, alcohol and infidelity, and his current efforts to help other veterans now returning to the U.S.

On another important topic, we have been covering the Marcellus Shale issue for almost a year and have built a seven-hour inventory of programs and town hall meetings that examine Marcellus from all angles. We're scheduling the entire series to air on the WQED Neighborhood Channel for a full week beginning Sunday, May 20 at midnight and continuing through May 26.
